SUBJECT: Francis E. Warren AFB Policy on Consumption of Alcohol by Individuals Under the Age of 21

1. Effective immediately, in the interest of ensuring safety on Francis E. Warren AFB, active duty personnel under the age of 21 who have an alcohol concentration in their blood or breath of or exceeding .02 grams of alcohol per 100 milliliters of blood will have their driving privileges suspended for 30 days. Two-time offenders will have base driving privileges suspended for 1 year. Those who are caught violating the suspension can lose base driving privileges for up to 2 years.
2. Additionally, Francis E. Warren AFB personnel under the age of 21 as well as any Francis E. Warren AFB personnel dependents under the age of 21 who operate or are in physical control of a vehicle who have an alcohol concentration in their blood or breath of or exceeding .02 grams of alcohol per 100 milliliters of blood will have their base driving privileges suspended for 1 year.
3. Individuals have the right to appeal the suspension. If determination of the appeal is denied, the suspension period starts upon written notification from the 90th Mission Support Group Commander. The suspension period for those not old enough to legally drive starts on the date that they are otherwise authorized to drive.
4. Unit commanders will process driving suspension recommendations along with relevant evidence through the 90th Security Forces Squadron.
